


17.) What was the most gratifying response you ever received to 19.) If you had it do all over again, would you be a painter? one of your paintings?


I'd have to say it was winning a prize in 1992 from the head curator of the Guggenheim while I was showing at the Boca Raton Museum. I really felt validated.



where self and the universe meet" has been the passion behind Panamanian-born artist Rogelio Pretto's work since its inception; in his current exhibition at D.A.N.A. Gallery in Coral Gables,






and vibrant new expression.

In this new show, Pretto offers us a dazzling display of large-scale, semiabstract works which, with liberal use of relief, play mesmerizing tricks on our perception of space. Through an exciting array of bright and playfully textured landscapes, the artist seeks to find a connection between the most mundane of objects-the container your takeout food came in, swimming goggles, a child's favorite plastic toy-and their place in the cosmos. At the same time, the collection celebrates the fact that infinity, by definition, cannot be contained. Each work is made up of two or more modular panels which

nderstanding "the juncture Infinito, this focus has found bold are designed to be randomly rotated and/or interchanged with others. The freedom to view the units in many positions breaks the boundaries of any fixed conception of the work: each new placement imbues any given panel, and thereby the exhibit as a whole, with a different meaning. With Infinito, Pretto is reemerging into the Miami art scene with a celebratory message: Infinity is here, and we are all in it.
