The entire company deserves the highest accolades for their commitment. This show is not an easy one to perform. Thunderstruck portrayals are so true to life that composure is often difficult for the viewer, as you feel every pain in brilliant hues. "Darkness at Noon" seethes, burning and churning a frightening pathway to horror, dark and angry.
